electric equipment on the load side of the delivery point shall be owned and maintained by the Consumer. If the service is furnished at Seller's primary line voltage, the delivery point shall be the point of attachment of Seller's primary line to Consumer's transformer structure unless otherwise specified in the contract for service. All wiring, pole lines and other electric equipment (except metering equipment) on the load side of the delivery point shall be owned and maintained by the Consumer.

2. Primary Service. If the service is furnished at primary distribution voltage, a discount of fifteen cents (\$.15) per KW shall apply to the demand charge, and if the minimum charge is based on transformer capacity, a discount of seven per cent (7%) shall apply to the minimum charge. However, the Seller shall have the option of metering at secondary voltage and adding the estimated transformer losses to the metered kilowatt demand and kilowatt hours.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

METER TESTS

1. All meters shall be checked for accuracy before installation. The Cooperative shall, at its own expense, make periodic tests and inspections of its meters in order to maintain a high standard of accuracy and to conform with the regulations of the Energy Regulatory Commission.
2. The Cooperative shall make additional tests of meters at the request of the members upon payment of a fee of five dollars (\$5.00). When the test, made at the member's request, shows the meter to be accurate within 2% slow or fast, no billing shall be made and the fee shall cover cost of the test.
3. When the test shows the meter to be in excess of 2% slow or fast, an adjustment shall be made to the member's bill by recalculating the monthly bills for a period equal to one-half (1/2) of the time lapsed since the last previous test, which in no case shall exceed twelve (12) months and the cost of testing shall be borne by the Cooperative.
